Welcome to Art in Norwich, Norfolk and beyond

As we leave the winter gloom and cold behind us, and spring flowers start to appear we can look forward to the warm summer months ahead. And hopefully some of the exhibitions and events listed here will help to get you out and about, enjoying the talent of the region.

Firstly festivals - the Norfolk & Norwich Festival runs from 10-26 May and First Light Festival on the beach and gardens in Lowestoft, Suffolk takes over the weekend of 22/23 June. Out There Festival has moved to 30 May to 1 June this year from its usual spot in September. Norfolk Open Studios is deferred to 2025 so several artist groups are organising their own with North Norfolk Open Studios, a collective of over 150 artists, taking place from Saturday 25 May to Sunday 2 June. The Golden Triangle Artists have a trail 25, 26, 27 May and 1, 2 June in the Unthank Road area of Norwich with 15 artists and ceramics studio taking part this year. Harleston and Waveney Art Trail which takes place 18 /19 and 25 /26 and 27 May 2024 on the Norfolk/Suffolk border.

And while we are in Norwich Lanes, Norwich Studio Art Gallery in Upper St Giles specialises in art and ceramics Eastern Europe run by artist Gennadiy Ivanov who is continuing the work he has been doing with the Climate Research Unit at UEA and in Canada.

Moosey in Labour In Vain Yard near The Guildhall specialises in work by illustrators and street art, and are hosting four exhibitions this summer – see page 35. Norfolk Contemporary Art Society (ncas) has a programme of talks and visits covering a range of topics to stimulate knowledge and

discussion as well as their popular art auction. The Sainsbury Centre has launched a new Universal Ticket which offers entry to all galleries and exhibitions on a pay-what-you-can basis which makes it accessible to all. They have the second of its new 'Big Question' seasons, What is Truth?

Norfolk Museums are hosting exhibitions around the county, and are looking forward to the reopening of the Norwich Castle Keep sometime in the summer 2024

Norwich & Norfolk Art Circle and Norwich 20 Group both run life drawing workshops and exhibitions see pages 39 and 46.

Norwich University of the Arts and East Gallery have taken on a new look with a refreshed logo and also a new building - the former Open/Barclays Bank in London Street which is set to become a new community space and welcoming point for the University.

About the Smartify app

Carry a tour guide in your pocket!

Smartify is a free app which is available for smartphones and tablets to enable people to connect digitally with arts and culture.

The idea of the app is that you can find out more about objects and artworks in a gallery or museum collection without cluttering the setting of the object with large interpretation panels. You can access lots of extra content and information about exhibitions, take tours, listen to talks and experience a deeper engagement through the app, either in the venue or remotely from your sofa before, after or instead of your visit.

You can search artists or galleries or specific pieces of work. The app also prompts you to discover new artefacts and exhibitions which you may not know of otherwise. Smartify also connects museums and art galleries both nationally and internationally enabling audiences to 'visit' venues that they wouldn't normally be able to get to such as the Museum of London (take The Clash tour), the National Gallery and Portrait Gallery, the Ashmolean in Oxford, the V&A in Dundee, the Smithsonian Institute in the US and many more. In Norfolk we are lucky enough to have the Sainsbury Centre at UEA as a partner venue so you can tour the exhibits and take a close look at special objects such as Henry Moore's *Mother and Child* either at home or in the beautiful Norman Foster building in the UEA campus.

Through two immersive audio experiences on the Smartify app, you can discover new ways to meet the living art in our collection.

Living Art, a tour guided by museum director Jago Cooper, invites you to meet art in new and explorative ways, unlike how you have experienced it in a museum before. You will be asked to touch the artwork, listen to it, move with it, and forge a personal relationship with it that can transcend time and artists' intent. Sharing Stories enables you to choose the voice of the artwork you want to listen to. With more than thirty contributors from all around the world, choose between artist, expert or lived experience.

You can also use the Smartify app to scan our objects if you want to find out more about anything in our collection. Ask at the reception desk for more information about how the app works and what you can find through it as well as other ways of navigating the galleries. Download the free Smartify app for either iPhone or Android phones and click 'Explore' to search for 'Sainsbury Centre'. Scan the QR code for a shortcut to the app.

In 1995 she moved to the UK for the role of Assistant Curator at the Mead Gallery, University of Warwick, before moving to Norwich in 1998 to be Chief Curator at the Sainsbury Centre for Visual Arts

Amanda succeeded Charlotte Crawley as the Director of the East Anglia Art Fund (EAAF) in 2015. In addition to this role she also curates independent exhibitions and frequently gives talks and guided tours.

The forthcoming exhibition *SUNLIGHT: Roger Ackling* at Norwich Castle is the practice outcome of her PhD study with Norwich University of the Arts. Amanda is an enthusiastic champion of artists in the region.

As director of EAAF, she is assisted by administrator Emma Hazell, Trustees and an Executive Committee – this group of distinguished members of the arts community keep the small team connected with the wider region and provide strategic direction. EAAF supports major projects at Norwich Castle and delivers a small grants programme, funding exhibitions in Norfolk and Suffolk. They provide for A-Level Masterclasses at Norwich Castle and offer seven scholarships annually at Norwich University of the Arts in the name of Suffolk artists Fred Dubery and Joanne Brogden.

EAAF membership gives free entry to members and a child at Norwich Castle and all the exhibition venues EAAF supports. It also gives a discount in the Castle café and shop and provides entry to the Membership rooms at Tate. 
Professor Louis Nixon is the Dean of Research and Knowledge Exchange at the Norwich University of the Arts

In 1990 he founded the collective Space Explorations and since 2001 Nixon has worked independently and exhibited widely in the UK and internationally, including solo exhibitions in London, Hong Kong, and Italy.





11th hour festival at St Nicholas' Chapel

Arts and culture has been established in King's Lynn since the 1950s. In 2021, the King's Lynn Festival celebrated 70 years of an annual programme of music, theatre and art in the town which continues in 2023. As well as traditional favourites such as Festival Too, the annual literature (in March) and poetry (September) festivals, the Shakespeare and Hansa Festivals and the Mart, there have been more recent cultural developments in the town.

GroundWork Gallery in Purfleet (see page 29) specialises in art which addresses environmental issues and includes exhibitions, talks and workshops and a meeting place for creative people. West Norfolk Artists' Association has over 70 members of active artists exhibiting regularly in various venues including St Nicholas' Chapel and Fermoy Gallery.

Greyfriars Art Space has moved into the Customs House opposite GroundWork Gallery in Purfleet.

Arts and tech company Collusion are now based in the White Barn, part of the Guildhall complex and run projects to develop visual and interactive content for the network of outdoor projectors that were installed in the town as part of an EU-funded project some years ago.

St George's Guildhall in King Street has received Towns Deal funding to enable a complete overhaul and renovation of this historic arts space and theatre, one of the oldest in the country and where William Shakespeare himself is said to have performed. It will be an arts complex, performance space and creative hub including the Fermoy Gallery and Shakespeare Barn King's Lynn Festival have a post-War British Art exhibition this summer, see page 33.

Artist and curator Gennadiy Ivanov works prolifically from his studio in Upper St Giles and at Outpost Studios.

In the last few years Gennadiy has been absorbed in a major environmental project, Transitions, with Trevor Davies, former Pro Vice Chancellor for Research and Director of the Climatic Research Unit at UEA and Professor John Pomeroy at Saskatchewan University. They have been working to represent aspects of climate change and its impacts to increase awareness in a wider range of people. They will soon complete a final project book as part of the UN Year 2025 for Glaciers' Preservation. UNESCO will publish and distribute it around the world.

Gennadiy has painted huge mural entitled *Climate Mural For Our Times*, a 10m x 1.5m set of canvasses, in the Council Chamber at City Hall, commissioned for the 50th anniversary year of the UEA's Climatic Research Unit in 2023.



Sainsbury Centre at UEA



The Sainsbury Centre is a world class art museum with a unique perspective on how art can foster cultural dialogue and exchange. Following a radical relaunch in 2023 the Sainsbury Centre is the first museum in the world to formally recognise the life-force of art, enabling people to build relationships across an arts landscape.

One of the first museums in the world to display art from all around the globe and from all time periods equally and collectively, Sir Robert and Lady Lisa Sainsbury created one of the most sought after yet nonconformist art collections.

In 1973 they donated their collection, which transcended traditional barriers between art, architecture, archaeology and anthropology, to the UEA, to be housed in Sir Norman Foster's revolutionary first-ever public building.

The art of the Sainsbury Centre is able to help reframe and answer the most important questions people have in their lives. The Centre's second season of its 'Big Questions' series asks WHAT IS TRUTH? The Sainsbury Centre investigates how we can know what is true in the world around us through a series of interlinked exhibitions.

Against the backdrop of fake news, elaborate scams and the burgeoning presence of Artificial Intelligence, are we experiencing a time when increasingly sophisticated technology can distort reality and diminish our own sense of authenticity?

Incorporating murals, paintings, textiles and historical objects, Gibson's work also weaves together text drawn lyrics, poetry and his own writing, complete with references to abstraction, fashion and popular culture. The exhibition will illuminate the rich practice of abstraction in Indigenous art.



Arts & culture in Great Yarmouth



There is a growing number of arts projects in Great Yarmouth recently, in newer venues as well as old favourites. Over the last few years, money has been invested and as a result the arts scene is growing. The Great Yarmouth Preservation Trust is also doing a great job restoring heritage for the benefit of the town.

St George's Theatre is a major venue with theatre, music and shows all year round. The theatre was refurbished a few years ago and has a fantastic interior – it is well worth a visit as well as checking out the programme which includes a wide range of repertoire from local productions to national touring shows.

originalprojects; occupies the former Debenhams store, now called PrimeYarc, a creative hub and gallery that truly connects with the community around it (see page 51).

Great Yarmouth Hippodrome has four major circus spectaculars a year as well as hosting concerts and shows from other producers. The Hippodrome is a unique place and a must-see venue - it never disappoints! The Empire on Marine Parade also has a weekly music offer with Djs and bands as well as street food, beer and cocktails.

Out There Arts (formerly Seachange) also runs regular circus and performing arts classes in their home at the Drill House as well as the epic Out There Festival with a new date of 30 May to 1 June (moved from September) and Fire On The Water which brings many visitors to the town to enjoy home-grown and international circus and outdoor arts performances in St George's Park and other locations around the town.

They have recently received funding to renovate the large Ice House building next to Haven Bridge as a culture hub.

Freshly Greated is a programme of community activities funded under Creative People and Places and reaches areas of Yarmouth often without cultural opportunities.

Time and Tide Museum (see page 66) has a regular contemporary art programme curated by Norfolk Museums, as well as permanent displays which describe the history of the fishing industry on which the town was built Great Yarmouth Minster is the main venue for organ recitals and classical music, again a spectacular heritage building in the north of the town.

The Great Yarmouth Arts Festival happens annually, taking place in September 2024.

The Venetian Waterways and Boating Lake is an Edwardian seaside attraction near the North Beach that that was restored as a result of Lottery funding. You can walk in the gardens, hire a boat or have a cuppa in the tearoom.

There is a thriving street art scene including Reprezent CIC which has created a trail of murals around the town in a grass-roots effort to spread public street art that embellishes and enriches the visual landscape of Great Yarmouth as well explaining the heritage and culture of the town.

The town itself is a cultural wonderland with traditional seaside style on one side - sometimes surreal as a Cinderella carriage comes around the corner - the famous Giant Snails, the Big Dipper, Model Village and huge sandy beach complete with donkey rides. On the other side, a rich maritime and industrial history on the river Yare on the docks at South and North Quay. In the centre, the marketplace, The Rows and historic buildings are testament to a trading past. Anna Sewell lived in a cottage near the Minster and Charles Dickens wrote and set much of David Copperfield in the town. More recently Greek, Portuguese and Eastern European residents have brought a wide range of cafés, bars and restaurants as well as traditional music and events. The market (famous for its chips and seagulls) has been recently refurbished with new stall added and the wonderful Victorian Winter Gardens along the seafront is about to be restored which is fantastic.

A quick guide to art in Norwich

Norwich is a medieval city which, in its hey-day, rivalled London in terms of size and was, for many years, England's second city, being only 100 miles from the court of London. It was a wealthy city with its fame built on the textile trade, weaving and particularly wool. Nearly half of the population was French, Dutch or Flemish and engaged in the weaving trade – hence the name of the football club, the Canaries, called after the birds which the weavers kept for company. In the Industrial Revolution, Norwich was off the beaten track for commerce and transport and so attracted artists, philosophers and radical thinkers, and was home to the famous Norwich School of Painters. Many religious non-conformists also settled here and the place became a hotbed for artists and writers, as it is today. It is also now a UNESCO City of Literature and twinned with Rouen, in Normandy.

Amongst its many cultural assets Norwich can claim:
Norwich University of the Arts, one of the best universities for courses in animation and film, fine art and illustration, architecture, games design, graphic design, fashion, media and much more, including East Gallery in St Andrew's Street.
Norwich Castle and the Sainsbury Centre at UEA are world-class venues, attracting national-level touring shows, with permanent collections of World Art as well as work by Picasso, Henry Moore, Francis Bacon, Modigliani, Degas and local masters – Munnings and the Norwich School of Painters including work from contemporary artists such as Colin Self, and now a growing


Norfolk and Norwich Festival in May, an international multi-arts annual festival with 17 days of concerts, outdoor arts and theatre, both mainstream and left-field, as well as an increasingly innovative and site-specific visual arts programme.

sculpture park at UEA.

Norwich Arts Centre is a multi-arts venue with a programme which includes live art, music and performance and the Norwich School has an events programme with a regular cycle of exhibitions in the Crypt Gallery in the Cathedral Close.

There are a number of artist-led galleries and studios, notably OUTPOST, Anteros Arts and St Etheldredas – and some well-established and very active, artists' groups such as Norfolk Contemporary Art Society, Norwich Print Fair, Norwich 20 Group and the Lonely Arts Club.

Venues such as St Mary's Works, Assembly House, The Undercroft and Greenhouse Gallery host exhibitions along with several commercial galleries such as Fairhurst and Mandell's. As well as Art in Norwich partners, there are over 900 practising visual artists and groups in Norfolk and a thriving underground arts scene in addition to the main institutions. www.artinnorwich.org.uk

Inland, market towns are also local hubs of activity. To the west and south are the Brecks – open heathland and forests.



ART IN NORFOLK

Norwich is set in the stunning county of Norfolk. It is the centre of a busy rural hinterland, varied and beautiful. Because there is space, there are over 800 visual artists working here and it has a long history of being a creative place. And the skies, the light and the landscapes have been an ongoing source of inspiration too. Across the county you will find many galleries and exhibitions in larger venues and also pubs and cafés.

For more, check local tourist information, the National Trust properties, Wolterton Hall, Mannington Hall and the market towns of Diss, Wymondham, Loddon and Harleston to the south, Holt, Aylsham, Reepham, Cromer, Sheringham, Salthouse, Blakeney to the north, Great Yarmouth and Lowestoft to the east, King's Lynn and Houghton to the west.

And if you fancy some non-art time, you can't beat the Norfolk coastline, the Brecks and the famous Norfolk Broads.



North of the City - take a walk



OUTPOST Artists Studios, Gildengate House, Anglia Square

The north of the city is busy place for new artists and creative businesses. Recently a plan to redevelop Anglia Square Shopping Centre was shelved which means that many artists that have been preparing to move are in limbo whilst a new plan is made. In all cities there is an area which gets a bit run down and property is left empty. As values drop, it becomes feasible for artists and start-up businesses to rent space. In some cases, enlightened developers allow artists to have spaces for 'meanwhile use' until areas can be redeveloped such as St Mary's and St George's Works just off Duke Street where the Shoe Factory Social Club and Lion House are accommodating artists and creative uses.

New galleries and spaces have popped up in Magdalen Street, and all along St Augustine's Street and the Norwich Men's Shed is in Pitt Street off Anglia Square.

Norwich Hackspace, Artpocket, the Royal Drawing School and a range of artists have settled into Lion House Studios in Muspole Street, right opposite the Muspole Street Studios which has accommodated artists and potters for many years.

The Shoe Factory Social Club has regular exhibitions and Coslany Art Space in St Mary Coslany church off Oak Street is being renovated prior to opening a gallery and studios.

Many of the studios in this area offer hands-on sessions in printmaking, pottery, drawing, textiles, illustration and painting as well as accredited degree courses.

Member-led group OUTPOST has run a gallery in Tombland for 18 years and also manages around 80 artist studios in Gildengate House in Anglia Square for now at least. These all give opportunities to emerging artists, students and creatives of all ages.

As well as galleries and art spaces, there are vintage shops, makerspaces and artist shops, ethnic foods, and antiques and collectables in dig-around caverns where you will find interesting bargains and artefacts.

Take a walk along Magdalen Street and find Anteros Arts, the Merchant House Café, Sahara Café, Looses, Dhaba at Fifteen, Aladdin's Cave, the Make Place and much more.

This is definitely an area of the city to have a poke around in and explore – please do!

Norwich Print Fair was the first Print Fair in the UK and was the brain-child of renowned mezzotint artist Martin Mitchell whose vision was always to champion traditional and contemporary printmaking techniques and to educate and involve the wider public. Normally there are around 30 printmakers displaying framed and unframed work for sale as well as greetings cards and other work.

Strangers' Hall, Norwich



One of Norwich's most historic buildings, this magnificent house has been home to many of the city's leading citizens since the 14th century.

Owned by a series of wealthy merchants, during the 16th century the house became known as Strangers' Hall, referring to the 'strangers' who came to work in Norwich as weavers from France, Belgium and the Low Countries. Now as a museum open to the public you can explore rooms furnished in the styles of different historical periods, brought to life with beautiful textiles, domestic objects and creative interpretation.
